
Salon duc Tape – A Fort Collins Large Methane User Fee – November 22nd

How would a Large Methane User Fee help Fort Collins meet its climate goals and promote climate justice?

One quarter of Fort Collins' greenhouse gas (GHG) pollution comes from burning methane (aka natural gas) within city boundaries. Fully half of that amount comes from commercial and industrial establishments. At the salon on **November 22nd**, **Kevin Cross** will outline a "Large Methane User Fee" (LMUF) proposal for making large methane users do their share to reduce the City's GHG pollution. The LMUF can be described as a "polluter pays fee," and would help Fort Collins meet its climate goals and contribute toward climate justice.

Kevin is the convener of the [Fort Collins Sustainability Group](#), which develops and advocates strategies for becoming a sustainable community, with a focus on reducing greenhouse gas emissions to levels consistent with a stable climate. He also convenes the [Colorado Coalition for a Livable Climate](#), which has a similar mission and works at the State level.
